Manufacturers introduced two new boards this year and class specific sails are on the increase.

In many countries, in most continents, the raceboard fleet remains one of the biggest fleets at national championships; in many inland locations it remains the biggest fleet. The 2011 championship calendar is finalized with 6 continental championships and two world championships confirmed.

The 2011 Masters European Games, scheduled for Italy, will include sailing, with windsurfing represented by the Raceboard class.
